- ✓ A three-lined poem typically about nature
- ✓ Usually does not rhyme

Haiku Poem Checklist

- ✓ Three lines
- ✓ About nature
- ✓ Follows 5-7-5 syllable pattern

Beautiful ocean

Roaring waves crash down on me

5 syllables

7 syllables

HAIKU

Haiku is a Japanese poem that does not rhyme. It is a poem that describes something in nature. Haiku poems have three lines, with a certain number of syllables in each line.

Line 1 = 5 syllables
Line 2 = 7 syllables
Line 3 = 5 syllables

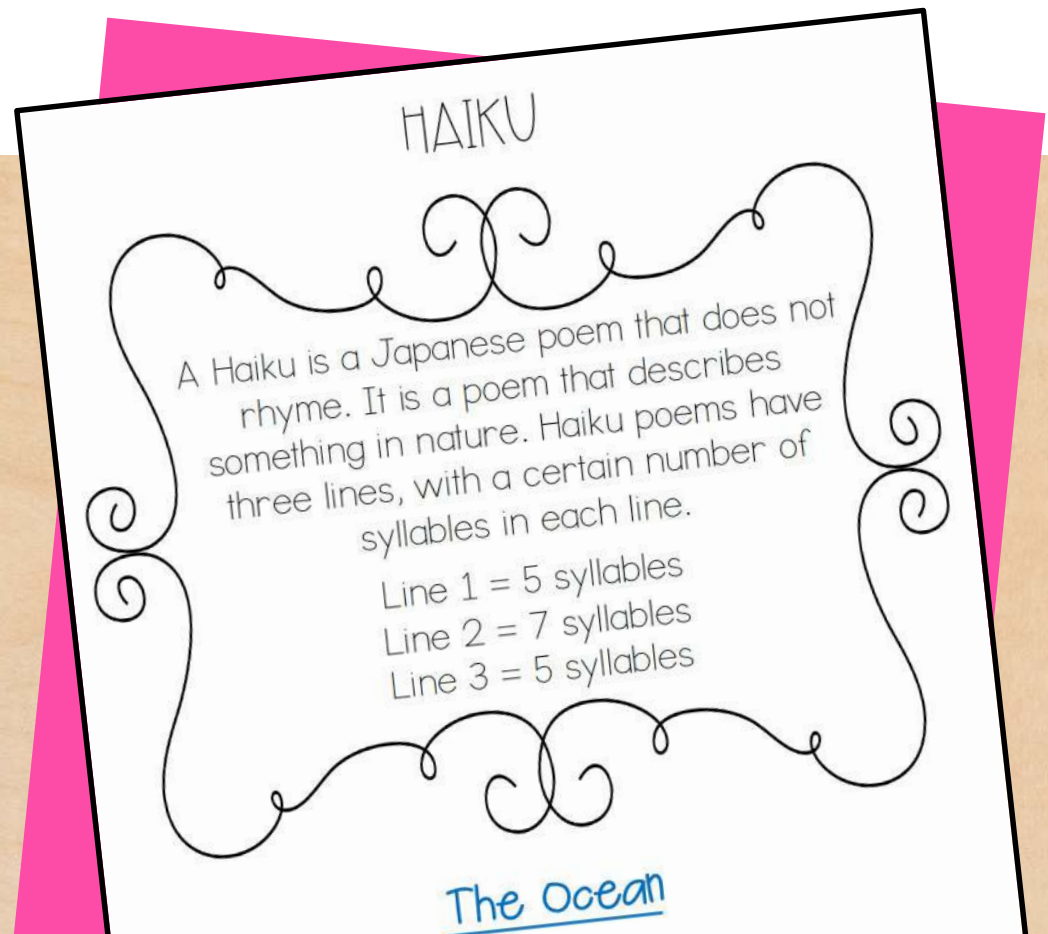

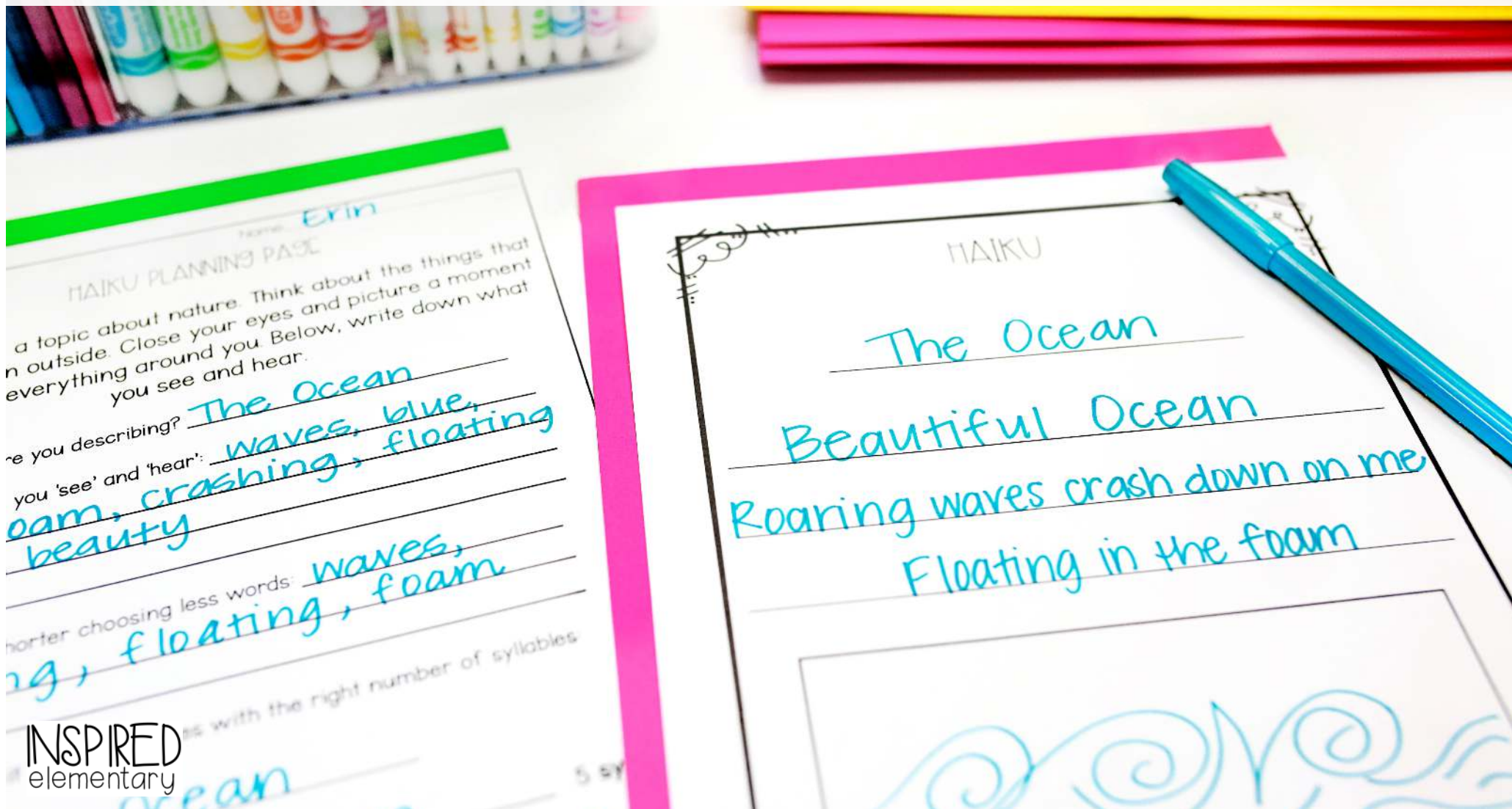
