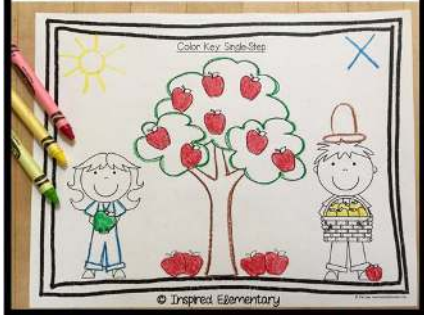


Color Key: Single-Step

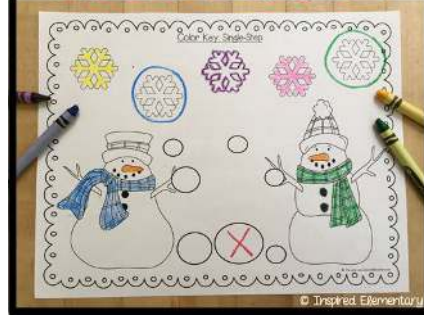

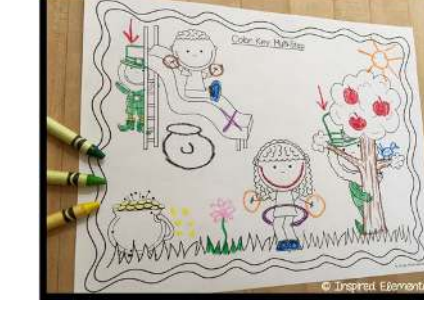

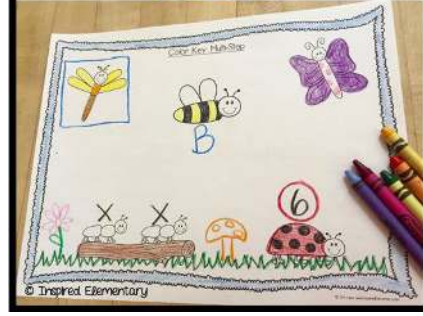

# **YOU CAN USE LISTEN AND COLOR AS AN ASSESSMENT:**

There are four activities included per month, so you can do one weekly. My students love doing this as a transition activity after recess or lunch.

There are monthly record sheets included, as well as yearly ones, so you can keep track of your students' progress. This is a helpful assessment tool to keep record of, especially when conferencing with parents about their child's listening skills in the fall and spring.

You can also use the record sheet template to easily create your own electronic assessment record sheet to meet your specific needs!

Each Listen and Color activity comes with a pre-colored answer key that you can display. This teaches students to self-assess their work at the end of the activity. Every activity has 10 directions, so the single-step directions can be out of 10 points and the multi-step directions can be out of 10 or 20 points.

# 1. CHOOSE IF YOU WANT TO USE SINGLE-STEP OR MULTI-STEP DIRECTIONS.

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Single-Step Directions

- Circle each hay bundle yellow.
- Color the "pumpkins" sign orange.
- Put a black X on the wheelbarrow.
- Put a red happy face on the largest pumpkin.
- Color the bird blue.
- Color both boys' shoes black.
- Outline the girl's hair red.
- Color both boys' hair brown.
- Color the girl's shirt pink.
- Draw a green star on the boy's shirt who is pushing the wheelbarrow.

Multi-Step Directions

- Find the hay bundles. Circle each hay bundle yellow and then color them in yellow.
- Color in the "pumpkins" sign orange and then color the wheel post it is attached to brown.
- Put a black X on the wheelbarrow. Then, color in the one wheel black.
- Find the largest pumpkin. Draw a blue square around it and then draw a red happy face on the pumpkin.
- Find the two boys. Color in their four shoes blue and both of their hair brown.
- Outline the girl's hair red and color her shirt green.
- Draw a blue X on the bird's body and then color the bird in with orange.
- Circle the pumpkin purple that the bird is sitting on and then color it in green.
- Find the boy wearing a scarf. Color the part around his neck orange and the rest of it blue.
- Find the two pumpkins in the wheelbarrow. Outline both pumpkins in orange and color their stems in green.

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**2. GIVE EACH STUDENT A BLANK COLORING PAGE AND HAVE THEM TAKE OUT CRAYONS.**



**3. STUDENTS COLOR IN AS YOU READ ALOUD THE DIRECTIONS. OR, YOU CAN RECORD YOURSELF READING THE DIRECTIONS AND MAKE THIS A LISTENING CENTER!**
