Rocks, Minerals & Landforms Vocabulary

Crystal: The solid, chemical structure of a mineral.

Habit: The repeating shape of a crystal.

Mineral: A natural, non-living solid material.

Streak: The colored mark that a mineral makes when it is rubbed against a (white tile) surface.

Moh's Soale: A comparison of minerals based on their hardness.

Rook: A natural, non-living material made up of one or more minerals.

Igneous: Describes rock that forms when completely melted rock cools and hardens.

Metamorphic: Describes rock that is changed by pressure and partial melting.

Sedimentary: Describes rock that forms when eroded sediments are pressed together.

Rook Cycle: The natural process that changes one type of rock into a different type of rock. Weathering: The process by which rocks are broken down into smaller pieces (sediments).

Eroston: The process by which wind and moving water carry away bits of rock.

Deposition: The process of dropping or depositing sediment in a new location.

Sediments: Bits of rook which are weathered and eroded from larger rooks.

Canyon: A narrow valley with steep sides, usually carved by a river.

Cliff: A high, steep wall of rock, ice or soil.

Hill: A small, usually rounded slope, that is not as tall as a mountain.

Mesa: An tsolated, flat-topped hill with steep sides.

Mountain: High, usually rocky land, with steep sides and a pointed or rounded top.

Volcano: A mountain formed by eruptions of lava and ash.

Plains: Low, flat areas with very few trees.

Plateau: A large area of high ground with a flat top and sloping sides.

Valley: An area of low land that Ites between hills or mountains.
